

NPIP Hatchery: Hens & Environment; Biosecurity

- Salmonella pullorum (pullorum disease)
- Salmonella gallinarum (fowl typhoid)
- Mycoplasma gallisepticum (MG, chronic respiratory disease)
- Mycoplasma synoviae (MS, infectious synov
- Salmonella enterica var. enteritidis (SE)
- Avian influenza (AI, fowl plague)



Examine as Remove from Shipping Box


Check Belly: Don't Squish Too Hard

Later Provide Food After Drinking







Other Alternatives... Hatching Eggs



- Source of Hatching Eggs: NPIP; Reputable
- Selecting Equipment: Incubator/Hatcher
 - Knowledge of Incubation Procedures
 - Marking Eggs and Candling
 - * Temperature: 99-100F (97-102F)
 - Humidity: 50-55% (1-17); 65-75 (19-21)
 - Periodic Egg Turning 3-5/day







Other Alternatives... Older Birds

- Ready-to-Lay Pullets
- Females Ready to Lay
- About 16-20 weeks old
- Mature Laying Hens
 - Hard to Obtain

Water

Feed

Draft-free

Comfortable








Warmth



- Brooder Lamp: Caution
 - Red Light: Can't See Blood
 - Center; 20 inches Above Litter/ No Paper
 - Away from Walls
 - Check after 5-10 minutes on Chick Distribution
- 95F under Lamp; Reduce 5F every week








Listen to the Chicks

Teach to Drink: Dip Beaks

18% Protein for Growth

Easy Access Day 1; Day 2 Regular

Show Food









Other Considerations: Floor Substrate

- Wood Shavings
- Clean Caked Areas Daily
- 3-4 in Deep
- Remove if Wet; Waterers
- Don't Use Cedar; Treated Wood







Other Considerations



- * Predator-Proof
 - Rats; Mongoose; Pets
- Quiet Area/No Loud, Sudden Sounds
- Enough Space; Prevent Overcrowding
 - Reduce Pecking
- Keeping Watch
